- Participating students will show evidence of their ability to give and receive constructive feedback on written work.

Description

The student will present written autobiographical, fictional and non-fictional experiences, which are shared orally for both appreciation and constructive input to enhance self-esteem, memory retention and writing ability.

Course Objectives

The student will be able to:

1. recall and present written autobiographical experiences.
2. present written fictional and non-fictional experiences.
3. demonstrate constructive input regarding classmates' work.
4. increase self esteem by successfully completing work.

Course Content

1. Recall and present written autobiographical experiences
 - a. At-home writing assignments: using writing prompts, students will write about past experiences
2. Present written fictional and non-fictional experiences
 - a. Class presentations: will share with other students work written in class or at home
3. Demonstrate constructive input regarding classmates' work
 - a. Participate in writing conferences to give each other constructive feedback about their writing
4. Increase self esteem by successfully completing work
 - a. In-class writing (quick-writes) to inspire creativity and develop writing skills and technique
