Description

This course introduces the fundamentals of construction scheduling, beginning with a foundational understanding of schedule logic and key terminology.

Course Objectives

The student will be able to:

1. Understand scheduling terminology, philosophy, and different schedule logic concepts.
2. Develop a detailed task list and progress to creating and maintaining a short-duration schedule.
3. Use their schedule as a communication tool and generate RFIs.

Course Content

1. Basic schedule terminology and concepts of scheduling.
2. Basic schedule management processes.
3. Communication methods.

Lab Content

Hands-on exercise to create a short-duration schedule using a general contractor (GC) schedule and task list.
